The Subsidence Workshop by NSW Government will have the following two sessions:

(1) The Subsidence Advisory NSW, Department of Finance, Services and Innovation, will provide information on:

- Proposed changes to the Mine Subsidence Compensation Act 1961;
- A new online claims portal and independent assessment panel;
- Mining companies' responsibilities for compensation;
- Compliance by mining companies with the claims guidelines, and
- Reduced levies to compensate for subsidence impacts from non-active mines.

(2) The Resources Regulator, Department of Planning & Environment, will provide information to assist the mine operators in:

- Complying with their obligations under the WHS laws in relation to subsidence, and
  - Identifying and controlling hazards that may cause harm to people from subsidence through the required Principal Hazard Management Plan and/or High Risk Activity Notification processes.
